Access to Higher Education (HE) Diplomas are qualifications designed for people who do not have the qualifications to enter a university level course. The courses are designed for mature learners (16+). This course is suitable for anybody who wishes to enter a wide range of nursing opportunities including occupational therapy, midwifery and many more. This course is designed to give students the opportunity to gain the necessary academic qualifications for entry into Nursing, Midwifery and other related degrees.

You will study a range of units covering aspects of Health Care including:

- Sociology
- Health Studies
- Human Biology

Together with units in English, personal development and research skills aimed at preparing learners for study at undergraduate level.

Entry Requirements: You will need to be 16+, have GCSEs in Math's and English (Grade C or above or be willing to do them) or Functional Skill Level 2 as universities generally require these qualifications. Acceptance onto this course is subject to successful guidance interview & assessment test

Assessment: There will be a mix of continuous assessment methods including essays and case studies.

Progression Route: This Access to Higher Education course in Health Care gives you the academic qualifications to University and opportunities for careers in nursing, midwifery and occupational therapy. It can also be used to gain entry into other applied social science degrees.
